The year was 1950 and the Iraqi government had just announced a denaturalization law which gave Jews a one-year window in which to leave the country on the condition they relinquish their citizenship, property, and wealth. 130,000 Jews fled, including the Shaby family with their young daughter Velda.

To the Jewish people, forced immigration is an old story, often bringing with it the culture, traditions, and history of far off lands.
