Lach L'cha!

I sit down to write my column for the June newsletter on a beautiful, sunny Memorial Day afternoon.

One of the perks, one of the privileges associated with my being the rabbi of this holy synagogue community, is that I am often called upon to be a representative of CBI and of the greater Jewish community in the greater non-Jewish community.

This morning, I participated, along with an Episcopal priest, a Catholic priest, and a Methodist minister, in a memorial service honoring the four military chaplains, who gave their lives attending to the needs of others, when the ship they were on, the S.S. Dorchester, was torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine in 1943. This memorial service was sponsored by the Disabled American Veterans Organization of Lawrence, MA.

Asked to talk a little about the Jewish chaplain, Alexander David Goode, I noted that, following in his Dad's footsteps, Rabbi Goode was ordained as a rabbi from Hebrew Union College. With the bombing of Pearl Harbor in 1941, he resigned from his position as a pulpit Rabbi to enlist as a chaplain in the Army Air Forces—the same military branch in which my Dad served during World War II. When the S.S. Dorchester was unexpectedly torpedoed, he, along with his fellow chaplains, gave their gloves, life jackets, and other protective and life-saving gear to the service people aboard. The 4 chaplains were last seen huddling together praying as the ship made its final decent into the sea.

Aware that I was one of perhaps 2, at the most 3, Jews present among the approximately 200 dignitaries, disabled veterans, and spouses and children of deceased war veterans in attendance, I also used the occasion, as I typically try to do, to teach a little about the beauty and wisdom of the Jewish Tradition. I began by pointing out that, among such important Jewish values as gratitude, justice, and humility, none is more important than that of "peace," with most all of the major Jewish prayers ending with a prayer for peace, and with Jewish People across the world, each Sabbath, greeting their family and friends with the same phrase, "Shabbat Shalom," "May your Sabbath be filled with peace!"

I also pointed out, however, that our 3,000 year old Tradition has taught the Jewish People an important lesson relating to maintaining peace, that being, that a strong and disciplined military is often the most effective, if not the only, way to ensure a peaceful existence. I emphasized that the Jewish People will forever be indebted to the U.S. service people, along with those serving in the military of our allies, who risked and gave their lives successfully opposing Hitler's maniacal efforts to conquer the world and exterminate the Jewish People.

I concluded my remarks, first, with a prayer, crafted by the Rabbinical Assembly, honoring those having served and currently serving in the United States Armed Forces, and, then, with my chanting in Hebrew, and translating into English, the *Ale Malei Rachamim* prayer.

After the memorial service concluded, a number of those in attendance came over to me to ask me questions about the Jewish Tradition, to share stories from their past relating to Judaism and Jewish People that they knew, etc. I headed home feeling even more honored and privileged to be able to represent this special synagogue community in the greater Jewish and non-Jewish communities.

I want to conclude my remarks on a totally different subject. One of the many great contributions that the Torah and the Jewish People have given to the world is the gift of Sabbath, and the awareness of how vitally important rest and relaxation are for all of God's creatures. From the beginning of August, when I begin preparing for the High Holy Days and my teaching at Merrimack College, through the end of May and the Holiday of Shavuot, I find it difficult to heed these words of Torah, resulting in my feeling, each year at this time, pretty physically, emotionally, and spiritually exhausted.

I have thus informed the Board of Directors, who have graciously said "go for it", that I am going to be on a "modified" vacation during the months of June and July this summer. "Modified" means that, while I will still be available, when I am in town, for any type of emergency, for pastoral counseling, etc., I will not routinely be leading services, writing and sending articles, etc. I again want to thank the Board for its support and understanding.

Wishing your loved ones and you a kayitz shalom, "a summer of peace, rest, and relaxation!"

We also have a Thursday night minyan twice a month on zoom only, to provide a space for us to pray together and to recite Kaddish for those of us in mourning or having yahrzeit. By being there for each other we again strengthen our community.

Our social action committee is always looking for ways that each of us can impact the world around us to make it a better place. We are reaching out to Ukraine and try to mitigate suffering and food drives in our area to reduce hunger. Susannah Abbott has the specifics listed in the newsletter. Again participating in these outreaches helps us feel more connected to CBI and our mission.

We can choose to participate in a book review. We read books that helps us understand who we are as Jews, where we have been and where we are going and how do we think. At our discussion we each have the opportunity to express our own thoughts of the book and again know more about each other and develop a closeness. We see plays together and movies together with Jewish themes which gives us more food for thought and expression. We take cooking classes together. We are now learning an old Jewish traditional game "Mahjong" playing Tuesday evenings together and having fun.

We celebrate holidays together. We Jews are fortunate; we are not lacking for holidays. We can even count Rosh HaShanna and Yom Kippur as "activities" and we can each get credit for Two "activities" in a month. Then there is Sukkot and Simchas Torah, another double header. Then we are onto Chanukah, Purim, Pesach, Shavuot, Tisha B'Av. And Remembrance Days: for the Holocaust and the State of Israel.

We at CBI are always looking for new ideas for "activities" we can do together. If you suggest one and lead one you can get Extra credit, and gain an automatic Two for the month. Not a bad deal.... So Please let the Rabbi, Janet, Jeff, Jon, or myself know any of your brilliant ideas and we can work on them together.




CBI AT THE RED SOX

JEWISH HERITAGE MONTH



According to HIAS's website:

The UN Refugee Agency reports that more than 5 million refugees have fled Ukraine to Europe since the war began, making it the fastest-moving refugee crisis in Europe since the end of WWII. UNHCR says there are more than 6 million internally displaced people in Ukraine and around 15 million people have been affected in the areas hardest hit by the war within Ukraine and are in need of humanitarian and protection assistance.

HIAS' long-time partner on the ground in Ukraine, Right to Protection (R2P), continues to aid refugees and displaced persons. HIAS has sent emergency funding to R2P, an independent NGO, to assist their response. R2P specialists are providing legal assistance; operating a hotline to provide information about services, evacuation, and refugee status; conducting protection monitoring at checkpoints and monitoring visits to those who have not left their home; and also distributing food and supplies.
