The respected 20th century Buddhist spiritual leader, Thich Nhat Hanh, wrote that the Kingdom of Heaven exists, not outside but within ourselves, and that experiencing the Kingdom of Heaven requires a peaceful mind and a heart full of love and kindness.

Recognizing that it is far easier to experience the Kingdom of Heaven, if one is part of a supportive and loving community, he established communities, known as "Plum Village Practice Centers," across the world, communities in which peace, generosity, and loving kindness were practiced.

While I have been able on my own, for brief and fleeting moments, to experience the feeling that Thich Nhat Hanh describes, I was given the opportunity, on October 15, to "bring heaven to earth" for an entire afternoon, as I took full advantage of being surrounded by a kind and caring community. I was somehow able to remain present and at peace, despite all of the challenges existing in the world around us, and to focus all of my attention on the people, who mean the most to me in my life, and on the love and kindness being shown by all those present.

In my Lach Lecha article this month, I thus want to thank you, the entire CBI community for the kindness, generosity, and love that you have shown me over the past 10 years and for having made my invited guests, especially my son, Charlie, feel so cared for and loved that afternoon.

I especially want to thank Janet and the committee members, Barabara & Bob Moverman, Co-Chairs, Rebecca Fishbein, Robin Rose, Jim Shainker, and Elaine Winic, and all those, who helped plan and organize the event; Bob, Bill, Robin, Carmen Vega, and Jeff, who spoke so eloquently and humorously that day; all those, who names appear in the event brochure and/or made a donation to CBI, and *aharon aharon haviv*, "last but not least," to the members of Bashert, who closed out the afternoon, not only singing and playing beautifully, but singing and playing a number of my favorite songs and prayers.

To a person, all of my guests, from each of my different "worlds," expressed to me how blessed and fortunate I am to be part of such a warm, caring, and loving synagogue community. Is it any wonder that I feel such gratitude and humility being the Rabbi here at Congregation Beth Israel?

I want to close by briefly sharing with you 2 important lessons that were really brought home to me that afternoon. I commented in my remarks, that day, how good it felt to hear the kind words being expressed, and how, as a result, I have come to better appreciate the Sephardic *minhag*, or "custom," of naming babies after living relatives. While I have long had a gratitude practice that includes letting people know how much I appreciate them, my having personally experienced how good it feels to be appreciated has inspired me to expand and to further this practice.

A second lesson was taught to me by my son, Charlie. As I drove him to the airport and in a subsequent phone conversation, he noted that, while he had often heard me talk about my work, my friends, and my congregants, this was the first time that he had has a chance to witness firsthand, what my friends and congregants thought of me, and that he now knew me in a more profound way.

I thus urge you not to make the same mistake that I made with my children and extended family. If you have not already done so, why not invite those close to you to observe you at work and to speak with the people with whom you work and interact. I think that we all want the people we love the most to see and know us, not only through their eyes, but through the eyes of others.

I also want to express my gratitude for the personal and very meaningful gifts that I was given, ranging from the beautiful inscribed *yad* to the personalized sweatshirt—and please do not worry, I am not planning on holding you to "10 more years!"

Tis the Season

I am not referring to the "Holiday Season", but instead to the season for being "Thankful" with Thanksgiving upon us.

As many of you know from reading my articles over the years, I often look for material and inspiration from Cindy Sherr (not related to Amy, but a dear friend of my cousin), who is the editor of the Jewish United Fund (JUF) monthly magazine out of Chicago. She also writes for other media as well.

I came across this article she wrote back in 2018 and I thought it was worth sharing with all of you. This story was also featured on NPR in 2020.

A.J. Jacobs traveled the world to thank everyone who helped make his cup of joe.

Manhattan-based humorist and author ended up thanking over 1,000 people, from farmers to steel workers, involved in making sure he was able to have his morning coffee.

JUF News via JTA — Author A.J. Jacobs has encouraged his three sons to be grateful for all they have.

He and his wife urged them to write thank-you notes, to thank the bus driver — even thank their household smart speaker Alexa for weather forecasts.

Jacobs, who is Jewish, sometimes says a prayer of thanksgiving with his family at the dinner table in appreciation of those who helped get food to their plates.

But not too long ago, Jacobs' son Zane raised an observation to his dad.

"You know these people can't hear you, right?" he asked.

Zane's remark got Jacobs thinking. Indeed, those people could not hear him.

So the Manhattan-based humorist and writer set out on a quest to thank everyone who plays a role in making his morning coffee possible.

He chose coffee because it was a more manageable undertaking than an entire meal — and he "can't live without" his java.

Jacobs chronicles the journey in his new book, "Thanks A Thousand: A Gratitude Journey" (TED Books), which will be coming out November 13 (2018) in conjunction with a TED Talk that he delivered on the same topic.

During his quest, which took him from a farm in Colombia to a steel plant in Indiana, he discovered how interconnected the world is. So many more people than he could have imagined contribute to his morning cup of coffee. Obviously, there are baristas and farmers, but also unsung heroes like artists (think coffee lid and sleeve designer), chemists, biologists, truckers, and miners.

MESSAGE OF THE MONTH FROM THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

"I went around the world and thanked everyone I could find," he said, "because they reminded me there are so many people who help with every little thing in our lives and we take them for granted."

All told, Jacobs said he thanked 1,000 people for his cup of coffee — and actually could have thanked way more.

Along the way, he learned that gratitude isn't just a nice gesture for the recipient — scientific research show it's healthy for the thanker, too. A study in Scientific American found that gratitude is the single best predictor of well-being and good relationships. Psychological research shows that gratitude can lift depression, improve our diet, help heart patients recover quicker and lead to overall greater kindness and happiness.

Before the quest, Jacobs said, his default mood was usually grumpiness. The adventure helped him change his mindset.

"I believe that genetically or culturally my default is negative — more a Larry David than Tom Hanks way of looking at the world. It's fun to watch on TV but not necessarily fun to live," he said.

And Jacobs is certainly not alone — people are genetically programmed, evolutionary psychologists say, to focus on what goes wrong in daily life because it was a matter of survival back in Paleolithic times.

But the result today is modern-day anxiety — a so-called "deficit mindset" — that's no longer helpful, said Jacobs.

To the contrary, "it's inspiring and energizing to focus on the hundreds of things that go right every day instead of the three or four that go wrong," he said.

Jewish teachings can help us move the needle on gratitude. In research for his book — as well as for his past best-seller, "The Year of Living Biblically," in which Jacobs embarked on a quest to live according to every precept in the Bible for a year — he learned that much wisdom on gratitude comes from Judaism.

"To be Jewish is to be thankful," one rabbi told Jacobs.

In fact, the very word "Jew," derived from the tribe of Judah, means thanksgiving. We as Jews deliver prayers of thanks from the time we wake up to the time we go to bed.

There is a catchphrase in Judaism that Jacobs learned during his research called "creed before deed."

At first, Jacobs said it was hard to feel gratitude, but if he went through the motions of acting with compassion and gratitude, eventually he would feel them.

"One of the best ways to go about life is to 'fake it til you feel it,' and it's an extremely Jewish way to live," he said. "If you act a certain way and follow the mitzvot, your mind will eventually catch up."

In October 2018, at an interview with <u>The Current's</u> guest host Piya Chattopadhyay., Jacobs said:

"There's hundreds, thousands of ... people that we take for granted,"

When speaking with his local barista, "She told me the hardest part is when people don't even treat her like a human, they just treat her like a vending machine or a kiosk and hand her their credit card, without even looking up from their phones."

He realized he had done that hundreds of times, and that "to just look someone in the eye, acknowledge they are human, is so important."

"It's so easy and small, but it has such a big impact on both you and the person you're dealing with, because we are wired to interact with humans face-to-face."

So as we get ready for our Thanksgiving dinners and then move on to the real holiday season, I would ask you to step back and take the time to thank those who make your life a better place each day; your family, your friends, your corner coffee shop attendant. In today's difficult world, I think we need to do more than just go around the table and say what you are thankful for, but actually go up to that someone, look them in the eye and thank them. It will not only make them feel more human but it will improve your mental health as well.

I have purchased a copy of A.J. Jabob's book, "Thanks A Thousand: A Gratitude Journey" and I will add it to the Temple library when I am done with it for any of you to borrow if you would like.

Please contribute to HIAS's efforts to provide relief to displaced Ukranians!

The Social Action Committee has created a fundraiser to support HIAS's work to provide relief in Ukraine. We have already made \$200 in donations, and hope to raise an additional \$550 for a total of \$750.

According to HIAS's website:

The UN Refugee Agency reports that more than 5 million refugees have fled Ukraine to Europe since the war began, making it the fastest-moving refugee crisis in Europe since the end of WWII. UNHCR says there are more than 6 million internally displaced people in Ukraine and around 15 million people have been affected in the areas hardest hit by the war within Ukraine and are in need of humanitarian and protection assistance.

HIAS' long-time partner on the ground in Ukraine, <u>Right to Protection (R2P)</u>, continues to aid refugees and displaced persons. HIAS has sent emergency funding to R2P, an independent NGO, to assist their response. R2P specialists are providing legal assistance; operating a hotline to provide information about services, evacuation, and refugee status; conducting protection monitoring at checkpoints and monitoring visits to those who have not left their home; and also distributing food and supplies.
