I would like to begin my *lach lecha* article for February by describing a ritual mentioned in the *Mishna*, a 2,000-year-old Jewish sacred text. The ritual described in the Mishna was practiced in the Second Temple Period (520 B.C.E. to 70 C.E., when the Romans razed the Temple and conquered Jerusalem.)

Several times, each year, tens of thousands of Jews would ascend to Jerusalem to climb the Temple Mount. Upon entering the enormous plaza on the mount, most of the people would turn to the right and begin circling the Mount in a counter-clockwise direction.

A second, much smaller group would turn to the left as they reached the Temple Mount and begin circling in a clockwise direction. This smaller group was comprised of those people in the community, who had experienced or were experiencing, for some reason, loss, sadness, and or loneliness.

When a person in the larger group, circling in a counter-clockwise direction, came upon a fellow Jew in the smaller group, the person would reach out verbally to the person in the second group and ask, "[T]ell me, are you OK? What happened to you?" The person in the second group would then, if s/he wanted, briefly explain the reason that they were sad or lonely. Perhaps the person had lost a loved one or had a child, who was ill, or had broken up with a romantic partner or spouse.

According to this particular *Mishna*, the person in the first group would say to the other person, "May the Holy One comfort and bless you," following up with "please know that you are not alone."

Both persons would then continue walking, with the person in the second group hopefully feeling comforted knowing that the person was not alone in this world, and that someone in their community cared about and was thinking of her/him, and the person in the first group looking forward to comforting another person.

What I have come to appreciate as the spiritual leader here at C.B.I. is that all of us, at some point in our lives, is going to lose a loved one or experience a setback of one type or another, and when this happens, it is up to the rest of us to open our arms and our hearts and provide, comfort, care, and support to the person in need.

I thought of this Mishna this past Shabbat, when the CBI community came together to celebrate Hilary Guida's adult Bat Mitzvah. In a society marked by loneliness and a focus on

the self, I have come, more and more, to appreciate the salutary, perhaps even unique, role played by a house of worship like ours in the community—in the words of Robin Rose, quoting "Cheers," "a place where everyone knows your name." One of the comments that was repeatedly made to me by my family and friends, for example, who attended the 10th anniversary celebration this past summer, was what a warm, caring, and supportive community they found C.B.I community to be.

In her outstanding *D'var Torah* this past Shabbat, Hilary cited the well-known aphorism, "[O]ne door closes and another door opens." An example of this in our own Tradition is that with the destruction of the Second Temple came the establishment of the synagogue; the rabbinic class replaced the priestly class; and animal sacrifice was replaced by prayer and the doing of acts of *gemillut hasadim*, "loving kindness" as the way for us Jews to express gratitude to God and to atone for our transgressions.

With the advent of the synagogue not occurring until the 1st Century C.E., it did not take the rabbis long to come to appreciate that, if the synagogues were going to be able to effectively carry out their holy missions, they were going to need the financial support of the community. Thus, we find the following teaching in the second century C.E. sacred text, *Pirkei Avot*, "The Teachings of Our Ancestors:"

Im ayn kemach, ayn Torah; im ayn Torah, ayn kemach. Without bread, there is no Torah; without Torah, there is no bread.

"Bread" is here in the same way that we use the word colloquially today to mean "money" or "financial sustenance" or "financial support".

Today, all nonprofit organizations, ranging from social justice organizations like The Southern Poverty Law Center, to religiously based community nonprofits like Lazarus House Ministries, to Jewish organizations like synagogues and local Federations are depending more and more on "planned giving" as a way to ensure the continued viability of the organization in the future.

For this reason, I would humbly ask you to read Jon Brody's important letter in this month's newsletter about the efforts C.B.I. is going to soon initiate to establish a "planning giving" program. Like a shooting star that continues to give light for years after it is no more, a bequest to C.B.I. will enable the synagogue to continue to be a light unto the Jewish and greater communities long after we are no more!

From Generation to Generation

For a change this month, I am not going to write about an article inspired by Cindy Sher from JUF Magazine. Instead, I am going to write about something inspired by the history of Jews going back centuries; namely, being philanthropic, helping the next generation as our previous generation took care of us and supporting our Jewish organizations.

At the end of 2021, a number of us from the Strategic Committee, working with our advisors from ESC, personally met with just about every member of our congregation to explain and layout the groundwork for our current Annual Fund model. Those discussions were very rewarding for both those of us delivering the message, and based on feedback received, to those whose homes we visited (sometimes via Zoom) to receive the message. For the most part, the Annual Fund concept has worked very well, and we have continued to reduce our deficit from earlier years. Our most recent fiscal year had the lowest deficit we have had in a long time. We should feel very good about what we have all accomplished but need to continue to support the shul at that level. So, what is the next step?

In those face-to-face presentations, we provided each of you with a copy of the presentation entitled "CBI Annual Fund: Moving Forward Together". On the second to last page of the presentation there was a page called "Legacy Giving." The page simply asked, "Consider making CBI a part of the legacy of your life." It gave examples that included, planned giving thru insurance policies/annuities, directed donor designated giving, outright gifts of money, stocks, real estate and other intangibles and concluded by asking you to remember CBI in your estate planning and will.

Over the next several months we will be putting together a program to provide you with information on how you can best do this and will likely ask to meet with you again personally to present it. In a recent USCJ survey, many shuls our size noted they survive by having an endowment to help them with their annual operating costs. We do not have one. Although we are fortunate and thankful to have a relationship with the Warren Fund, which is an endowment that was associated with Temple Beth El and now with us, these funds are directed toward non-operating expenses. We therefore need to create an endowment to produce annual income to help fund operations and reduce the annual deficit.

We are a small shul of 50 or so member units which includes about 75 senior adults. Each of us likely has a will or will be creating one in the next 10 years. When people respond to why they don't have a bequest in their will for a charitable organization, the most common response is that they weren't asked. Consider this and the discussions that will happen over the next several months as OUR ASK!



Please contribute to HIAS's efforts to provide relief to displaced Ukranians!

The Social Action Committee has created a fundraiser to support HIAS's work to provide relief in Ukraine. We have already made \$200 in donations, and hope to raise an additional \$550 for a total of \$750.

According to HIAS's website:

The UN Refugee Agency reports that more than 5 million refugees have fled Ukraine to Europe since the war began, making it the fastest-moving refugee crisis in Europe since the end of WWII. UNHCR says there are more than 6 million internally displaced people in Ukraine and around 15 million people have been affected in the areas hardest hit by the war within Ukraine and are in need of humanitarian and protection assistance.

HIAS' long-time partner on the ground in Ukraine, <u>Right to Protection (R2P)</u>, continues to aid refugees and displaced persons. HIAS has sent emergency funding to R2P, an independent NGO, to assist their response. R2P specialists are providing legal assistance; operating a hotline to provide information about services, evacuation, and refugee status; conducting protection monitoring at checkpoints and monitoring visits to those who have not left their home; and also distributing food and supplies.


