# Lach L'cha!

I begin my March Lach Lecha column with several personal anecdotes followed by a story from the Book of Exodus and a teaching from the Jewish Tradition:

- 1. When I was a child my mother and father hosted both nights of Passover seder. Each seder meal began with *Knaidlich*, or Matzah Ball Soup, and at each seder, I would say to my *Zaydee*, whom I loved dearly, but who ate very slowly, "can't you eat a little faster, I finished my soup 10 minutes ago." I said this to him, because my parents had made clear to my siblings and me that we were all going to wait for Zaydee to finish his soup or gefilte fish or whatever else he may have been eating before we would start the next course out of respect for him.
- 2. Several months before my bar mitzvah, my grandmother was diagnosed with stomach cancer. Within a matter of days, the decision was made by my parents and my father's siblings that she would move in with us, with my giving up my bedroom and moving into my brother's bedroom. When my grandfather was no longer able to live alone, my aunt and uncle added a bedroom and bathroom to their home, so he could live with them.
- 3. Immediately prior to my coming to CBI, I participated in a one-year chaplaincy residency program at Yale University Hospital in New Haven. Just down the block from my apartment on the Yale campus was a relatively large apartment complex inhabited primarily by Asian families. Each Sunday afternoon, as I would take a walk around the campus, I would be struck and moved by the Asian families, three sometimes four generations, walking together, with the elders in the family setting the pace for the younger members of the family.
- 4. It is generally taught in the Jewish Tradition that one cannot see God and live. Yet, in *parasha Mishpatim* in the Book of *Exodus*, we are taught,
  - "Then Moses and Aaron and Nadab and Abihu (Aaron's sons and seventy elders ascended (Mt. Sinai); and they saw the God of Israel....Yet God did not raise God's hand against the leaders of the Israelites; they beheld God, and they ate and drank." [Ch. 24:9-11]
- 5. "You shall rise before the elderly and show deference to the aged." [Leviticus 19:32] Interestingly, on public buses in Israel, the first row of seats is marked with a sign quoting this verse. The reason for this that the elderly, in Judaism, are regarded as having a special wisdom that comes with life experience.

Unfortunately, our secular society takes a far different view of the elderly. So much is made in the news today, for example, about the age of President Biden, because he moves more slowly than he once did, and his memory is not as acute as it once was. What I find interesting are the "Letters to the Editor" in the New York Times from neuroscientists and psychologists, who are Mr. Biden's age; who are still active and practicing their professions; and who point out that the wisdom that Mr. Biden has gained from his life experience more than compensates for whatever physical and memory limitations resulting from his age.

For many years my Dad earned his living as a forensic engineer, testifying in significant cases across the country. I remember a phone call from him, while I was in rabbinical school, in which his voice was unusually subdued. He proceeded to tell me that he had made the difficult decision to retire from his profession. Knowing how rewarding and meaningful he had always found his work, I was quite surprised and asked him 'why' he had made this decision? He responded that a number of the lawyers for whom he had worked were telling him that now the he was 75 years old, even though his mind was as sharp as ever, juries would tend to disregard, what he had to say based solely on his age, and for this reason, they could no longer use him as an expert witness.

This past week, I was blessed to turn 79 years old. I thus want to thank the entire Congregation Beth Israel community for inviting me back for another year to serve as your rabbi despite my fast approaching my 8<sup>th</sup> decade of life! Knowing each of you as I do, I have no doubt that we will together continue to treat the elders in our community with the respect and deference that they deserve for this is what our Tradition teaches and expects us to do!

# MESSAGE OF THE MONTH FROM THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

Over the last month, and in the months ahead, our Programming Committee and Social Action Committee have been creating and implementing a large variety of opportunities and activities with which to get involved. In many cases, it almost seems like a new flyer announcing the next "something "is coming out every week! (Thank you, Janet for creating all these great flyers!) Our CBI Cares Committee has been graciously keeping our freezer stocked with meals that can be delivered to those in a state of "need" in our community. Our Rabbi has spoken recently at several church gatherings in the area trying to put the Israel–Gaza war in perspective. Our Saturday morning and every other Thursday night minyans are going strong. If you have participated in any of the above, kudos to you. YOU are the heart of our comm<u>YOU</u>nity. Our activities, gatherings, services, etc. are important not just for "fun, learning, and getting together," but all combined with your participation help create a special CommYOUnity!

On a much more global scale, many of you may have seen the powerful piece in the last *Jewish Journal* dated 2/15/24. It was 12 pages long and thus became its own supplement to the regular biweekly edition. Steve Rosenberg (editor of the *Jewish Journal*) is the author and photo journalist of this piece entitled: "A Reporter's Notebook- an Eyewitness Account from Israel - in the Land of War and Hope". He starts by documenting many of his journalistic activities, films, and interviews of previous trips to Israel. This trip was very different though. It was his first trip back to Israel since October 7. This time, he focused on the state of affairs in current day Israel which drastically changed that day. He interviewed soldiers, victims, families of hostages, and many others that could give the feel of the Country.

The bulk of the information gathered and presented was difficult to read because of the many emotions his writing evoked. If you have not read it yet, I strongly encourage you to do so. (I had to read it in segments though, to allow myself time to process what he presents.) Fortunately, it isn't just gloom and despair. He concludes with stories of resilience and new growth. I would thus like to share some of these excerpts with you as we enter the month of Adar II, in which we are supposed to "Be Happy".

(S. Rosenberg interviewing Ronen Koehler, a reserve Israeli Navy officer and one of the leaders of the protest movement that engulfed Israel last year. The movement then known as Brothers in Arms, was started by active and former IDF reservists and high -tech leaders who opposed Netanyahu's plan to overhaul Israel's judicial movement.)............ But on Oct. 7, the organization shifted its priorities and became a humanitarian non-profit [Now known as 'Brothers and Sisters for Israel' -the country's largest humanitarian aid organization].

# MESSAGE OF THE MONTH FROM THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

Well organized with a database of over 70000 names and emails, the group's leaders sent out an email that day encouraging all IDF reservists to report for duty. Almost immediately, the group realized that it could fill roles that the overwhelmed government could not. Within a day, it had raised about \$6 million. Soon, 15000 Israelis had volunteered to help the group. These days, the group has raised about \$30 million, with half of the donations coming from outside the country. We just said we're going to help," Koehler said. "We started getting calls from people saying 'we're stuck in our secure room. Can you take us out?" The group of former officers then set out about extracting and rescuing over 100000 Israelis who were not safe in their homes near Gaza, and also on the Lebanese border near Hezbollah.

In the weeks and months that followed, the organization and its volunteers worked to fill a massive void in social services. It distributed hundreds of thousands of meals, 40000 units of medical equipment, set up logistics centers to assist displaced citizens, distributed 10000 pieces of life-saving medical equipment and helped thousands of Israelis obtain immediate mental health care. These days, one of its main focuses is creating dozens of temporary schools for as many as 15000 kids who were displaced.

- (S. Rosenberg quoting former P.M. Ehud Ohlmert.) "This is the greatest expression of solidarity that you can find any place in the world. This is the inner strength of Israeli society, more than anything else........What binds us together is a sense of mutual responsibility and solidarity, which is unique. Absolutely unique."
- (S. Rosenberg quoting Dr. Gilad Bodenheimer, the psychiatrist who helps run the country's Health Ministry, said that) "the war proves that Israelis need one another. We really learned that we need to help each other because no one else will help us if we won't help each other. That's something in our DNA. It's very, very structured in how we are raised and how we are taught, and everything we do."

This too is our extended CommYOUnity.

May we soon see real SHALOM!!



The Social Action Committee has created a fundraiser to support HIAS's work to provide relief in Ukraine. We have already made \$200 in donations, and hope to raise an additional \$550 for a total of \$750.

According to HIAS's website:

The UN Refugee Agency reports that more than 5 million refugees have fled Ukraine to Europe since the war began, making it the fastest-moving refugee crisis in Europe since the end of WWII. UNHCR says there are more than 6 million internally displaced people in Ukraine and around 15 million people have been affected in the areas hardest hit by the war within Ukraine and are in need of humanitarian and protection assistance.

HIAS' long-time partner on the ground in Ukraine, <u>Right to Protection (R2P)</u>, continues to aid refugees and displaced persons.
