Lach L'cha! By Rabbi Howard Mandell



The month of August is a time of vacationing and rest and relaxation for most people. For congregational rabbis, however, the coming month is one in which we clear our calendars to begin our final preparation for the High Holy Days.

On a more mundane level, the month of August also constitutes for most congregational rabbis, like myself, the first month of a new contractual year. As I was driving back this past week from my sister's and brother-in-law's, I started counting the number of years that I have now served as your rabbi. "12 years" is the number that I came up with, which means that I will be starting this August my 13th year at CBI.

The realization that I am now beginning my 13th year as your rabbi raised initially several competing emotions for me. On a positive note, I feel very blessed and honored to have served for so long as your rabbi. On a more sobering note, I was reminded that I am no longer a "spring chicken," with my having entered this past February my 9th decade of life; and finally, with my having been raised in a secular culture and society that fears and thus avoids the number 13, whenever possible, I thought about simply telling anyone, who might ask, that I am now in my 14th year here at CBI.

Fortunately, however, I do not have to make a choice between avoiding the number at all costs as our secular society does—the number 13 does not appear as a street address in most places, as a row number in most commercial airlines and theatres, and as a floor in most hotels—and or telling people that I am beginning my 14th year at CBI, lying by a rabbi being frowned upon universally.

No, I do not need to make this Hobson's choice, because in Judaism, the number 13 is held in high regard as demonstrated by the fact that the number is used in Israel to designate floors in buildings, bus numbers, apartment numbers, etc.

Rabbi Ishmael's 13 rules of interpretation of scripture serves as an introduction to the morning prayers; Maimonides 13 Principles of Faith appear in the prayer, Yigdal, that is often sung Friday evenings; and of course, we chant on Yom Kippur and on Jewish Festival Holidays the "13 Attributes of God's Mercy".

May the month of August be a time for your families and you of both rest and relaxation and of self-reflection in preparation for the Hagim!

The Power of 10

What do people think of when they hear the number 10?

Perhaps **10 fingers and toes** which is the second question often asked when a new baby is born...usually just after the question "is it a boy or a girl"?

Is it Alexander Hamilton who graces our \$10 bill?

Is it that the number 10 is the **base of our decimal system** and the **powers used in the metric system**?

Is it the **Perfect 10**, made famous from Nadia Comaneci in the 1976 Olympics or Bo Derek in the movie "10"?

Is it your **favorite athlete**? There have been some tremendous stars in each of the major sports including Pele, Eli Manning, Fran Tarkenton, Tyreek Hill, Walt Frazier, Guy Lafleur, and Lefty Grove to name a few.

Is it the **10 Commandments**? In May, we finished the counting of the Omer period which is the 49 days from the second seder until the holiday of Shavuot which celebrates the receiving of the Ten Commandments. They are:

- 1. You shall have no other gods but me.
- 2. You shall not make or worship any idols.
- 3. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.
- 4. You shall remember and keep the Sabbath day holy.
- 5. Respect your father and mother.
- 6. You must not murder.
- 7. You must not take someone else's husband or wife.
- 8. You must not steal.
- 9. You must not lie.
- 10. You must not be envious.

Is it perhaps the **10 Commandments of Creativity** that relates to the Imagineering workshops that both Jeff and I have been discussing over the past 6 months?

1. **We Shall Embrace Curiosity**: Always question, explore, and seek out new experiences and knowledge.

- **2. We Shall Overcome Fear**: Do not let the fear of failure or judgment hinder our creative expression.
- **3. We Shall Experiment Boldly**: Take risks and try new approaches without being afraid to make mistakes.
- **4. We Shall Collaborate Freely**: Engage with others, share ideas, and build on each other's creativity.
- **5. We Shall Stay Open-Minded**: Welcome diverse perspectives and be willing to change our thinking.
- **6. We Shall Nurture Imagination**: Dedicate time to dream, visualize, and let our minds wander.
- 7. We Shall Seek Inspiration: Draw inspiration from nature, art, people, and everyday life.
- **8. We Shall Persist Relentlessly**: Pursue our creative endeavors with determination and resilience.
- **9. We Shall Value Playfulness**: Incorporate play and fun into our creative process to spark innovation.
- **10. We Shall Reflect Regularly**: Take time to reflect on our creative journey, learn from experiences, and continuously improve.

But do any of the above make you happy?

I came across another set of 10 that may make a difference in your life if you learn to practice and embrace them. They are called **Aristotle's 10 virtues for Happiness**. Aristotle was a Greek philosopher. He defined happiness as eudaemonia, which means "good spirit". In his concept, happiness was a divine state that would visit each of us if we allowed it. Our responsibility was to open the door to receive it by living well. Eudaimonia is reached by living virtuously and building up your character traits until you don't even have to think about your choices before making the right one. Such a person will be happy, but not in the same way as a hedonistic person. They will strive for self-improvement and will live their lives to the fullest. They will be the kind of person that others want to be like. Above all else, they will flourish.

Aristotle's 10 Virtues of Happiness

- 1. **Identify what you fear and face it.** Otherwise known as **Courage** or **Strength**. The midpoint between cowardice and recklessness. A courageous person is one who is aware of the danger but goes in any way.
- **2. Learn your appetites.** Otherwise known as **Temperance** or **Tolerance**. The midpoint between being overindulgent and insensitive. Aristotle would view the person who never drinks just as harshly as the one who drinks too much

- 3. Magnanimity. Otherwise known as Modesty. It is the virtue that is at the midpoint between not giving oneself enough credit for the achievements made due to low self-esteem and having an excessive ego that makes us think that we are the center of the universe. It is about recognizing our mistakes and virtues, assuming the responsibilities that correspond to us, neither more nor less.
- **4. Give back.** Otherwise known as **Charity** or **Liberality**. The midpoint between being a miser and overextending yourself.
- **5. Friendliness.** Otherwise known as **Sociability.** While being friendly might not seem like a moral virtue, Aristotle claims friendship is a vital part of a life well lived. This virtue lies between not being friendly at all and being too friendly towards too many people.
- **6. Control your temper.** Otherwise known as **Patience**. The midpoint between getting angry and not angry enough when you should.
- **7. Don't lie.** Otherwise known as **Honesty or Truthfulness**. The midpoint between habitual lying and being tactless or boastful.
- **8. Grace.** Otherwise known as **Wittiness.** At the midpoint between buffoonery and boorishness, this is the virtue of a good sense of humor. It is just being, so that others enjoy your company.
- 9. Decency. Otherwise known as Shame. The midpoint between being too shy and being shameless. The person who has the right amount of shame will understand when they have committed a social or moral error but won't be too fearful not to risk them. A decent person respects himself and is not afraid to make mistakes but does not fall into insolence or impertinence trying to pass over the others. He is aware that everyone deserves to be treated with respect and demands that same respect for himself.
- **10. Justice.** Otherwise known as **Fairness.** This is the virtue of dealing fairly with others. It lies between selfishness and selflessness. This virtue can also be applied in different situations and has a whole chapter dedicated to the various forms it can take.




