# Lach L'cha! By Rabbi Howard Mandell



While sometimes used interchangeably, the terms "charity" and "tzedakah" are different in several significant ways. Giving charity is something a person does voluntarily, with one's reason for doing so, ranging from wanting to support one's favorite college or orchestra, to helping those in need, to simply wanting to reduce one's tax liability at the end of the calendar year.

Giving *tzedakah*, on the other hand, rather than being a matter of choice, is, for us Jews, a *mitzvah*, a religious and moral obligation, with the giving of *tzedakah* being an essential element to one's living a just and righteous life. In the Book of Deuteronomy [15:7], God declares:

"If, however, there is a needy person among you...do not harden your heart and shut your hand against your needy kinsman. Rather you must open your hand and lend him sufficiently for whatever he needs. Give to him readily and have no regrets when you do so, for in return the Lord Your God will bless you in all of your efforts and in all your undertakings."

The Jewish sacred texts consistently make clear, moreover, that obligation to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, provide shelter to the homeless, etc., applies to both our Jewish and non-Jewish brothers and sisters, for all human beings are created in the image of God and are entitled to be treated with respect and dignity. While I do think it important that all of us be aware of the distinction between "charity" and "tzedakah," I am writing about the giving of tzedakah, in this, my November Lach Lecha column, because the need for us, individually and as a community, to fulfill this mitzvah is especially acute at this time. Because of a variety of factors, including but not limited to, the increasing cost of groceries and shelter, the cold of winter fast approaching, and the precarious financial status of the SNAP Program (The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), local food pantries and homeless shelters, like Lazarus House Ministries, Bread and Roses, Cor Unum, and "Neighbors in Need" are in dire need of additional funds.

A recent Boston Globe article points out, for example, that one third of the families living in the City or Lawrence—this is one of the highest percentages in the State--are dependent on food stamps to feed themselves and their children—it should be pointed out here, that food stamp recipients include veterans, children, working adults, etc. Even with so many residents of the City of Lawrence currently receiving food stamps, Lazarus House Ministries, alone, on whose board I have served for the past 6 years, are currently feeding almost 2,000 meals a day.

I just received today an email from Lazarus House, moreover, urging board members, like me, during this critical time, to contact their families and friends urging them to make financial donations, undertake food drives, etc.

I am thus humbly, respectfully, and sincerely asking you, my family and friends here at CBI, to seriously consider making a donation to The Rabbi's Discretionary Fund or directly to the nonprofit food pantry/homeless shelter of your choice, so that we can together, as one holy community, fulfill the following important teaching from the Book of Deuteronomy: "tzedek, tzedek, tirdof—"justice, justice, you shall pursue."

# **VOICES FROM THE BOARD**

I have contributed for a number of projects for the shul mostly relating to the building or technology.

If you attended any of the High Holiday services on Zoom or saw the view of the Bimah on screen, you may have seen a curious phenomena. When we had draped the white cover on the Bimah as it wrapped around the microphone and hung down, it made the form of the Star of David. What made it interesting is that you only saw that figure on the screen, but not if viewing it in person. I am sure there is a lesson there somewhere - maybe the importance of seeing things from different perspectives.



I am currently researching **Assisted Listening** options for the sanctuary that would allow someone with a hearing aid or earphones tune to a feed from the sound system. Technology for doing this has evolved along with radio technology. In the 1940s, they started including a **telecoil** (T-coil) in some hearing aids. This telecoil can pick up a signal from a **hearing loop** installed in the venue that transmits the audio from the sound system avoiding the distortion due to distance, background noise, or poor acoustics. Today I understand about half of the hearing aids sold in the United States contain telecoils. However, wiring a facility for transmission has been expensive and prone to interference and issues with coverage and, in addition, not all users understand the capabilities of their hearing devices and how to use them.

Some more recent systems have used WiFi transmitters to broadcast an audio signal from a sound system. Since hearing aids do not support WiFi, an intermediate device is required to receive the broadcast and then convert it for the hearing aid. This intermediate device could be a smartphone or a small battery-powered dongle typically worn on a neck lanyard during use.

# **VOICES FROM THE BOARD**

The latest Assisted Listening technology is **BlueTooth** which has become more commonly supported in hearing aids allowing users to pair with a phone or a television. A more recent BlueTooth version called BlueTooth LE (low energy) Audio is more efficient than classic BlueTooth and reduces the drain on the end device battery. Last year they finalized the standards for a BlueTooth feature called **AuraCast**. Unlike traditional BlueTooth which has been a one-to-one pairing between two devices, **Auracast** supports casting audio to multiple devices simultaneously.

Receiving devices could be hearing aids, smartphones, wireless headphones, or wireless speakers. Some Android phones now support **AuraCast**; however, iPhones as yet do not. As with the WiFi-based systems, if the end listening device does not support **AuraCast**, an intermediate device is required to receive the broadcast and then convert it for the end listening device. Systems have now started coming to market with an **AuraCast** transmitter that can be fed from a sound system or PC along with lanyard receivers to act as intermediate devices. The challenge for each user will be to understand what their end listening device supports and how to tune to the multicast.

I am currently testing a very inexpensive AuraCast system that comes with a small rechargeable transmitter that can attach to a PC or television via USB-C connector or headphone jack and 2 rechargeable clip-on receivers with headphone jacks that are pre-tuned to the transmitter.


By the way, the Celebration Booklet that I was unprepared for is now among my prized possessions. It need not clutter my "memory vault of intangible treasures."
